### **UR WALPOLE 2023**

In its 24th year, UR Walpole is an eco-education programme that runs in Term 2 every year immersing students in their local area and community. It is always a busy but enjoyable event on the Walpole Primary School calendar and this year has been no different.

This year the topic was FIRE. Students explored this theme across the learning areas and engaged in many rich learning tasks.

All classes went on some exciting excursions including a trip to the Fire station for the YK-1 class. the North Walpole Bush fire brigade for Y2-3's, and the Year 4, 5 & 6's went to Horseyard Hill to look at the planning required for a prescribed burn.

All the Year K-6's went on the WOW cruise with Gary Muir. The K-1s enjoyed a trip to learn about fire. The Y2-3's learnt about the fire triangle and the Y4-6 students learnt about how different plants and animals respond to fire. They also heard about William's quokka study and the effects fire had on them and their recovery rate. Thank you to Gary, Emma, and Wayne for taking us out on the WOW cruise.





Guest speakers - Gary Muir and Charles Biddle, used fun scientific experiments to communicate the fire triangle and the properties of fire.



Thank you to all the teachers, staff, parents, and community members who have made this year's UR WALPOLE programme possible. UR Walpole provides students with many exciting memories.


























### From the Principal
