This year the topic was FIRE. Students explored this theme across the learning areas and engaged in many rich learning tasks.





From the Principal

Welcome to Term 3 as we enter the Noongar Season 'Djilba' (August - September) is represented by the colour pink as it symbolises growth of wildflowers and plants. This is the start of the massive flowering explosion that happens in the South West. Beginning with the yellow flowering plants such as the acacias.

Djilba is a transitional time of the year, with some very cold and clear days combining with warmer, rainy and windy days mixing with the occasional sunny day or two. Traditionally, the main food sources included many of the land-based grazing animals including the yongar (kangaroo), the waitj (emu) and the koomal (possum).

As the days start to warmup, we start to see and hear the first of the newborns with their proud parents out and about providing them with food, guiding them through foraging tasks and protecting their family units from much bigger animals, including people!

The woodland birds are still nest bound, hence the swooping protective behaviour of the koolbardi (magpie), djidi djidi (willy wag tails) and chuck-a-luck (wattle birds). As the season progresses and the temperatures continue to rise, the flower stalks of the balgas (Grass Trees) emerge in preparation for the coming Kambarang season.

Ms Maria Miranda will be joining our wonderful school on Monday 14 August to teach in Room 1 for the remainder of the year. Ms Miranda has spent the last few years teaching in the Mid-West. Please welcome Ms Miranda once she arrives.

We have a lot going on this term. Room 4 has begun a great project called Walpole-Centre of the Universe, well supported by Mr Peter Hill (Creative Schools Project). The Spare Parts Puppet Theatre are presenting a performance of Blueback and providing two workshops for our students (supported by Cash for Cans). The West Coast Eagles are providing the students a presentation on healthy lifestyles and a football clinic. In Week 6 we have our Book Week Parade and the Winter Carnival.

Tuesday 8 August we are hosting another STEM Night. The theme for this event is 'Old Fashioned Games'. The event will be held from 5 - 7pm at the Walpole Rec Centre. A light meal can be purchased for \$# per head. Come along and enjoy the games of yester year.


