ENGINEERING/STEM IS WHAT WE'RE ALL ABOUT THIS TERM IN D AND T

Who says math has to be taught using pencils, paper and books? Learning about measurement is integral to the building and constructing of projects by all students this term, and the application of applied mathematics embeds the importance of math in our everyday lives. It also helps answer the age-old mathematics question - "why do we need to know this stuff"?

Pre-primary students are using rods to understand number value. They are using a ruler to measure the rods and then create mazes from various materials that they have measured and cut to size. They are then learning how to place the measured elements to form their mazes.

The structure of towers is being examined by the year one, two, threes. Students have been looking at how towers use engineered modules for strength and stability. They are making their own modules to construct strong, tall towers.

Year four, five, Sixes have been researching bridges and bridge construction to gain an understanding of how bracing can enhance the strength of materials. They have been taking materials that are in and of themselves relatively weak, then using a variety of techniques to strengthen them.

The Noongar Season 'Bunuru' is represented by the colour orange and is the hottest time of the year. Bunuru is the hottest time of the year with little to no rain. Hot easterly winds continue with a cooling sea breeze most afternoons – if you're close to the coast.

Traditionally this was, and still is, a great time for living and fishing by the coast, rivers and estuaries. Because of this, freshwater foods and seafood made up major parts of the Noongar people's diet during Bunuru.

Bunuru is also a time of the white flowers with lots of white flowering gums in full bloom, including jarrah, marri and ghost gums.

Pre-emptive School Closure

Thank you to our parents and carers for their support and understanding with our pre-emptive school closure on Tuesday 20 February. It turns out that the actual conditions exceeded that of the forecast and was a very uncomfortable day. Please inform the office if you weren't directly informed of the school closure so that we can update your best contact details.

Each year we have multiple whole school evacuation drills so our students are well rehearsed and prepared in the event we should ever need to evacuate. The below is a summary of this procedure:

- Based on advice from DFES and/or and Emergency Services students are evacuated
- The signal to do so is a continuous school emergency siren (airhorn)
- Staff assist students to evacuate in an orderly and calm manner to Room 7 where they are accounted for this is the building identified by DFES as the safest in the event of a bushfire.
- Designated staff ensure no students, staff or visitors have been missed in any locations around the school.

In the event of a real fire:

 Parents receive emergency text message alert via our new "Message You" service and notification on Dojo to inform you of student's relocation. Please keep in mind that we ask that parents not collect students until instructed it is safe to do so.

NAPLAN - National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy

This year, NAPLAN is being conducted in a 9-day testing window from Wednesday 13 March to Monday 25 March.

NAPLAN is the Australia-wide National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy. All our students in Year 3 and 5 are expected to participate in tests for Reading, Writing, Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy. NAPLAN provides a snapshot of your child's level of achievement at this point in time, but it is only one component in a range of assessments which inform us about your child's needs.

If Year 3 or 5 families have any questions or you are concerned about your child's participation in NAPLAN, please contact their class teacher or myself, NAPLAN Coordinator.




Families are reminded that if your child is unwell with cold or flu like symptoms that they stay home until their symptoms resolve.
