Earlier this term we purchased 20 new iPads which has made the online NAPLAN tests run very smoothly. Once testing has completed, the iPads will be homed in Room 2. This will allow every student to have access to an iPad to help support their learning. Voluntary contributions have assisted greatly in the purchase of these devices.

We have recently calculated the cost per student of the swimming lessons held in Week Two this term. The final figure was just over $\$ 30$ per students which is considerably less than the amount we requested in Term Four 2023. Parents who paid upfront have received a credit to their child's account and student financial summarises have been sent home with students. Room 4 students are starting to get excited about their camp to Perth in Week 9. Ms Walker has prepared a great itinerary that includes the new ropes course at the Gloucester Tree in Pemberton, ice skating and a visit to Fremantle Prison.
