As we move forward, let's continue to embrace the spirit of growth and learning that spring brings. Thank you for your ongoing support and dedication to our school community.



The Year 4, 5 7 6 students at Walpole Primary School have had the privilege of participating in this exciting initiative. Students collaborated in teams to create innovative projects that either assist astronauts in space or address Earthly challenges using space technology. Among their imaginative solutions were:


- A comfortable bed for astronauts.
