Our Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) team has been hard at work developing a new approach to behaviour management at our school. PBS focuses on teaching students the appropriate ways to behave in all school environments in a positive and supportive manner. We are excited to share more about this approach with parents and families soon, as we believe it will foster a more inclusive and supportive school culture.

While we have made significant improvements in attendance this year, we still have room for growth. In 2023, only 44% of our students were regular attendees, attending 90% or more of the time. However, in the first semester of 2024, this number has increased to 56%. Regular attendance is crucial for students to build upon their learning, develop confidence, social skills, resilience, and teamwork. We appreciate your continued support in ensuring your children attend school regularly, as this is fundamental to their ongoing success.

Thank you for your ongoing support and involvement in our school community. We look forward to seeing you at our upcoming events and continuing to work together to provide the best possible education for our children.

Here at Walpole Primary School, we love to participate in Children's Book Week each year and it's coming up soon! The theme for 2024 is Reading is Magic with delightful artwork to promote the event created by Australian artist Jess Racklyeft.

We'd love to see you here!






## Does your child wet the bed?

WA Country Health Service offers a Nocturnal Enuresis (Bedwetting) Program for children aged 5½ to 17 years. The Program runs over 6 – 8 weeks with specialised support from a community health nurse.

Are you and your child ready to take action to achieve night-time dryness? The first step is to make an appointment with a doctor for a check-up and referral to the Program.






