Ms Walker plans and implements interesting, relevant and individualised lessons for her mixed age class.



The new **Sleep for Families Program** is now available in the Families section of the Smiling Minds App. Research identifies that many people experience trouble falling asleep, staying asleep, or waking too early and not being able to get back to sleep. About one third of school-aged children may have sleep problems, which will inevitably affect the amount of sleep you enjoy as a parent.
