Book Fair

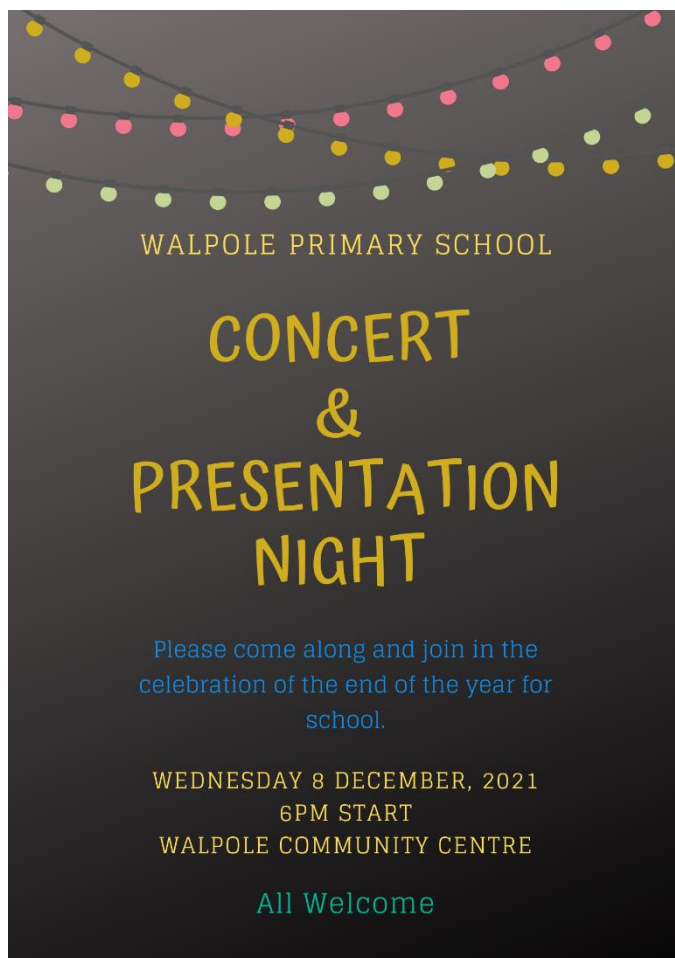
