They were concerned about lack of applications and general disinterest in focusing on the job once someone was employed. They want staff who turn up every day and know they have to start at the bottom tier.

The main take away ideas for me were that we have to teach: commitment to follow something through, overcoming difficulties and clarifying expectations and instructions.


