Welcome back to term 2. Hopefully you enjoyed some time relaxing with your family.

We've started our URWalpole program with the theme, 2021-41 Future Proofing Walpole. This involves looking at things we can do now to make Walpole, and the world, a better place in twenty years time.

The students will research a variety of local plants and animals that we can help preserve. They will visit the Tree Top Walk to do an autopsy on a tree and Bannister Downs to look at their automated dairy.

A highlight for the Yr 4/5/6 students is to go on camp and get a deeper insight into concepts covered this term. This year they are going to Perth.

Thank you to the Walpole Op Shop for generously donating \$1500 towards transport. This makes the trip much more affordable, especially when there is more than one child in the class from a family.

Cross Country

The Faction Cross Country will hopefully be held at the Walpole Country Club on Wednesday 26 May. This is a great event and many families come along for the afternoon to watch.

We also need people to stand along the track to direct students. The more helpers we get, the more likely that everyone gets to see their child participate. Please let the office know if you can assist. There are different lengths to run, depending on age. The K/P/1s run 850m, the 2/3/4s 1.6km and the 5/6s 2.2km. This seems a long way but the students have been practicing and can walk if they get tired.

We normally send a small team to the interschool event at East Manjimup PS. However, with the scale of road works, we can not get there in the time frame required. We also looked at combining with Denmark PS but their event is while the students are on camp. So this year, we will not send a cross country team to participate with other schools.


The National Assessment Program-Literacy and Numeracy will commence, for Yr 3 and 5 students, May 11. The tests assess Reading, Writing, Spelling, Grammar and Numeracy.

The tests provide information to teachers so that they can plan learning opportunities for individuals and the group. It also provides a comparison with schools across the state and country.

Parents are given an overview of their child's performance compared to the school and country.

There is no need for parents to help students prepare for the test as this has been done in class. However, it is important that the students attend school and are well-rested.
